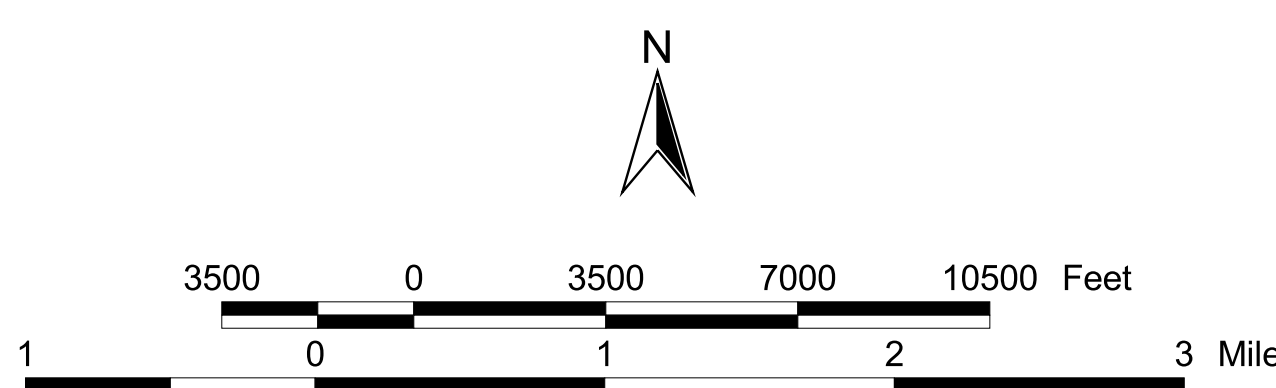
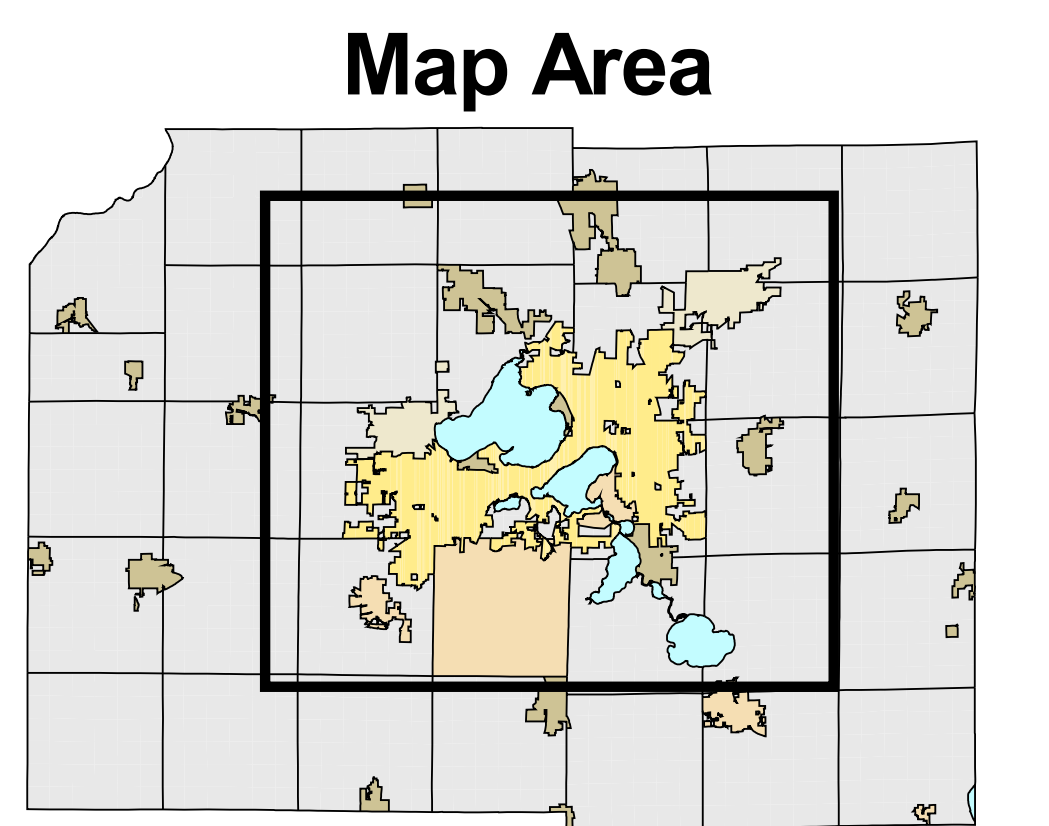

### Evaluation and Selection Process

- 1. Block Groups <= 2 square miles with population density >= 1000 people per square mile.
- 2. Adjacent Block Groups <= 2 square miles with population density between 500 and 1000 people per square mile.
- 3. Adjacent Blocks with population density >= 500 people per square mile.
- 4. Hops to high density Block Groups or Blocks within 1/2 miles.
- 5. Indentations and donut holes.
- 6. Jumps to high density Blocks or Cores within 2 1/2 miles.
- 7. Hops to high density Blocks within 1/2 miles.
- 8. Indentations and donut holes.

- Blocks and Block Groups with population density requirements that do not meet adjacency criteria.
- Census Block Boundary
- Current Urban Area Boundary
- Open Water
